FORUM SECTION – CALL FOR PROPOSALS 2012-2013

International Political Sociology responds to the need for more productive collaboration among political sociologists, international relations specialists, and sociopolitical theorists. As part of our commitment to theoretical innovation, new modes of empirical research, and geographical and cultural diversification of research beyond the usual circuits of European and North American scholarship, IPS publishes a forum twice yearly. These fora are short position pieces on issues that are important for IPS, rather than a full article or symposium.

We invite new proposals for new fora to be published in 2012 and 2013, organized around a question of importance to IPS, such as a thinker or school of critical thinking, a methodology, or an pressing debate in a cognate field.

Successful proposals in the past have included global society, the role of law, the financial crisis, IPS perspectives from the global south, phenomenology, and responses to particular authors or texts, such as Foucault, Bourdieu, and Weber's "I Am an American."

Formal requirements

Proposal must include one page description of the question the contributors will engage, and why that question is important for IPS, a list of contributors and their titles. Each contribution must be between 1000-2000 words, with a maximum word count of 10,000 words for the entire forum.

They should be formatted according to the overall IPS guidelines regarding referencing and style. (available at <http://www.blackwellpublishing.com/submit.asp?ref=1749-5679&site=1>). Proposals in languages other than English will be considered.
