NOTICE TO CONTRIBUTORS

Research in Question (RiQ) is an on-line publication of the Center for International Studies and Research (CERI-Sciences Po) available on the center's website and open to a variety of contributions such as field studies, theoretical and methodological discussions or conceptual reflections. Please note that we will only consider original manuscripts – i.e. papers which have not been previously submitted to or published in any other scientific journal and which present the very first outcomes of a work in progress. The main purpose of *Research in Question* is indeed to facilitate an early dissemination of exploratory findings and to allow the authors to benefit from comments and observations resulting from the posting of their preliminary research conclusions on the Internet. Authors of a paper published in *Research in Question* should ask the authorization of the Editorial Board to republish it elsewhere, in which case reference should be made to RiQ.

Research in Question publishes manuscripts in French and in English. All accepted articles are made available free of charge on the Internet, but they can also be sent out by e-mail upon request. A limited number of paper re-prints are also available.

Manuscript submission

All manuscripts should be addressed by email only to the two Executive Editors of *Research in Question*, Gilles Favarel-Garrigues (favarel@ceri-sciences-po.org) and Sandrine Perrot (perrot@ceri-sciences-po.org). They must be sent in Word format as attachments to your electronic message.

Your submission message must also include:

- an abstract in both French and English (1000 to 1500 characters maximum each);
- a short biographic note of the author (1000 to 1500 characters) including his/her current title and position, institutional affiliation and two or three main previous publications;
- a comprehensive bibliography presented according to the model below.

Photographs, illustrations, maps, cartoons, graphics, audio and video clips in relation to your contribution may also be included. However you must obtain authorization by their author or copyrights holder, in accordance with the copyright Acts.

Contributors are expected to conform to the guideline for manuscript presentation outlined below. CERI will take care of the technical transformation of the texts into a web-compatible format.

Manuscript presentation guidelines

Word count.

The word count for articles should be comprised between 60,000 and 150,000 characters (spaces included).

References.

Bibliographic references should be included in the footnotes.

Bibliography.

It should be presented according to the French norms. Please use the following forms:

Book:

LAST NAME, First Name, *Title of the book*, City, Publisher, year, number of pages.

Collective book:

LAST NAME, First Name, *Title of the book*, City, Publisher, year, number of pages.

Journal article:

LAST NAME, First Name. « Title of the article », *Title of the Journal*, volume, number, publication date, pages.

Article / chapter of an edited book:

LAST NAME, First Name. « Title of the article/chapter », in First Name, LAST NAME OF THE EDITOR (ed.), *Title of the book*, City, Publisher, year, pages.

On-line Journal

Author's LAST NAME, First Name. « Title of the article », *Title of the journal*, volume, number. Available at: URL address [date of consultation of the website].

Website:

NAME OF THE INSTITUTION or LAST NAME of the author, First Name of the author. (date of consultation of the website). Title of the home page [on-line]. URL address.

Interview:

Interview (day, year, month). Person interviewed, title or position. Interview by ...

Review and publication procedure

The papers taken into consideration for potential publication by the Executive Editors will be submitted, anonymously, for peer review by one or several reviewers from outside the CERI. A synthesis of the reviews, also anonymous, will be transmitted to the author.

Depending upon the result of the reviews, the Executive Editors can decide:

- to immediately accept the manuscript;
- to refuse the publication;
- to envisage a publication if the author accepts the modifications suggested by the reviewers. The revised version of the article will be evaluated one more time in order to decide if the text is ready for publication.

Accepted articles can be subject to additional editorial work, which will be done in cooperation with the author.
